

Empire State Building was built in the years 1930-1931 in Midtown Manhattan in New York City. It is one of The World's Most Famous Buildings and also a magnificent Art Deco skyscraper typical of pre-World War II architecture in New York. Art deco is the Main decorative art style of the 1920s/30s. characterized by precise and boldly delineated geometric shapes as well as strong colours mostly used in household objects and in architecture. Building has 102 stories and 1,454 feet at its pinnacle. Was designed by William F. Lamb, one of the architects Shreve, Lamb and Harmon firm. The Empire State Building was built in an extremely short time, in 410 days. Using no less than 3,400 men each day, they managed to set up four and a half stories per week.

Both entrances lead to two story-high corridors around the elevator core, crossed by stainless steel and glass-enclosed bridges at the second-floor level. Shimmering starbursts and metallic touches gild the halls, elevators, and ceiling. The elevator core contains 67 elevators. The building owns observatories on 86th and 102nd floor; and also additional indoor observatory on the 80th floor. During night, the top 30 floors are illuminated with colored lights which change colors according to seasons and events.

With its soaring height and signature design, the Empire State Building defines the New York City skyline.
